

### WALKING TOUR SERIES: MODERN **GEMS OF AMBLESIDE**

Tuesday, July 4—Thursday, July 6, 2023

This year was the inaugural launch for West Coast Modern Week's series of Walking Tours. The tour, titled the Modern Gems of Ambleside, was a two-hour tour (approximately three kilometers) around the Ambleside waterfront. Led by our experienced volunteer guides, the tour explored several fascinating mid-century apartment buildings along Bellevue Avenue and Argyle Avenue. While observing the elements and features of the mid-century modern style, the tour examined how the hallmarks of this iconic style were uniquely incorporated into West Coast architecture.

Registration and check-in were at the garden of the West Vancouver Art Museum. From there, the tour explored the surrounding area and concluded at the West Vancouver Memorial Library, where participants had the opportunity to reflect on the tour and view some of the tour's featured buildings in miniature form at the exhibition on display, The Bricktacular West Coast Modern Show: Paul Hetherington.

As part of West Coast Modern Week, the Barry Downs Architecture Lecture featured Sidney Williams as the 2023 guest lecturer.

The West Coast and the California desert share spectacular scenery, but extremely diverse natural environments. How did the architects design in concert with the natural elements of climate in these regions? Looking at architects' own houses, where often they designed for challenging sites, with more modest budgets, Williams compared and contrasted their approaches.

#### About the speaker:

Sidney Williams was director of education and public programs before becoming curator of architecture and design at the Palm Springs Art Museum from 2003 to 2016. She was the founding curator of the Architecture and Design Center after a historic rehabilitation of a 1961 bank building which opened in 2014. Currently, she is active in the Palm Springs Architectural Alliance that focuses on fostering the legacy of Palm Springs's architectural excellence into the future.

### FAMILY WORKSHOP

### Deconstructing a Boat with Sara Graham

Sunday, July 9, 2023

As part of West Coast Modern Week, Monova: Museum and Archives of North Vancouver invited visual artist Sara Graham to lead a family-friendly workshop at the Museum of North Vancouver. Deconstructing a Boat is a project inspired by Frank Gehry, who has used an origami technique in the past as an inspiration for his designs.

Participants created patterns on both side of a piece of paper, then folded an origami boat. Then, the boat was unfolded and using the folds as guides, 3 cuts along the fold were made. Then from that point participants constructed a three dimensional form. This activity deconstructed a familiar form—the boat and transformed it through imagination and play.

### The Bricktacular West Coast Modern Show: Paul Hetherington

MAY 5 – JULY 31



The models featured in this exhibition are made from a material that many of us will recognize. Building blocks that usually come in sets with complex instructions that culminate in all sorts of architectural wonders, imagined or real. Less familiar here will be the houses on which these particular models are based.

The artist, Paul Hetherington, has visited each of the buildings depicted in this exhibition, and using the standard building blocks available, recreated them, incorporating their surrounding landscapes, furniture, and even, art. Instead of step-by-step instructions, he has consulted original architectural plans and historical photographs in order to better incorporate all of their unique features. All but one of the original buildings are in West Vancouver and they each represent an important part of the history of design in the local community. With its steep terrain and ocean-fronted cliffs setting unusual challenges, architects have built extraordinary homes here. These homes are considered to have been created as a part of the design movement commonly called "West Coast Modern". They were designed between 1941 and 1981, and despite their unusual qualities, also share common features, such as a desire to bring the outdoors in, to challenge the materials used in construction, and to situate the building appropriately on each site.

### Order from Chaos: Jane Adams and B.C. Binning

JUNE 21 – SEPTEMBER 23



This exhibition explores the art of B.C. Binning and Jane Adams, and how the former influenced the work of the latter. Adams is the daughter of Jean Coulthard, the Canadian composer, and Don Adams, who ran a modern Scandinavian furniture store in Vancouver. The Adams' were close friends with B.C. Binning and his wife, Jessie. As a child, Adams visited Binning's studio and became familiar with his paintings and designs. As she developed her own artistic practice, she came to recognize the impact of this early influence. This exhibition includes works by Binning from the Collection of the West Vancouver Art Museum.
