



We celebrated the launch of West Coast
Modern Week at Isetta Cafe Bistro. This
fundraising event also marks the West
Vancouver Art Museum's 30th anniversary!
Architects, designers, artists, and friends of the
West Vancouver Art Museum enjoyed drinks
and canapes while grooving to live DJ set of
1960s vibes.

Originally built to house a diner, gas station, and car garage, this iconic West Vancouver building was designed by Scott and Furnadjieff Architects in 1961 and renovated in 2022 by Design Architecture Everyday Inc. and Campos Studio. Over the years, the threestructures on the site have cycled through many tenants. The original gas station is no longer in use and instead, along with the west building, houses some of the property owner's extensive vintage car collection.













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WALKING TOUR: THE JEWELS OF DUNDARAVE

This was the second year of West Coast Modern Week's series of Walking Tours. The tour, titled The Jewels of Dundarave, was a two-hour tour (approximately two kilometers) around the Dundarave waterfront. Led by our experienced volunteer guides, Linda Holden Clode and Susan Walker, the tour explored several fascinating mid-century buildings. While observing the elements and features of the mid-century modern style, the tour examined how the hallmarks of this iconic style were uniquely incorporated into West Coast architecture.

PANEL DISCUSSION

SITE | LIGHT | CADENCE | SPACE **ARTHUR ERICKSON REVISITED**

Date: Wednesday, July 10, 7-9 p.m.

Location: The Polygon Gallery

Presented by the West Coast Modern League in partnership with the West Vancouver Art Museum and The Polygon Gallery. This year marks the centenary of Canada's pre-eminent architect Arthur Erickson. Erickson defined site, light, cadence, and space as his four first principles of architecture, elements that are each critical to the understanding of his design explorations. From these, he created some of our region's most cherished modern buildings, from single-family residences to significant cultural and civic spaces. The panalists shared their work on Smith House II, Filberg House, and the Museum of Anthropology, respectively.

LECTURE SERIES

FROM CITY TO CITY UP THE COAST FEATURING ALAN HESS

Date: Thursday, July 11, 7-9 p.m. Location: Kay Meek Arts Centre

As part of West Coast Modern Week, the Barry Downs Architecture Lecture featured Alan Hess as the 2024 guest lecturer. North America's West Coast created its own unique modern architecture in the 20th century. From San Diego to Vancouver, the region's distinctive natural conditions, industries, and cultures inspired a spirit of experiment that attracted freethinking architects eager to try new ideas far from the influence of the Eastern establishment. The results varied from city to city, but together they became a laboratory for innovation that shaped Modernism globally.

About the speaker:

Architect and historian Alan Hess is the author of 21 books on modern architecture and urbanism in the 20th century. He is a Commissioner on the California State Historical Resources Commission and serves on the boards of Preserve Orange County and Palm Springs Modernism Week. He has been the architecture critic of the San Jose Mercury News, a contributor to The Architects Newspaper. He has helped to restore landmark buildings from the modern era, including CBS Television City and Bullock's Pasadena.

FILM SCREENING ARTHUR ERICKSON'S DYDE HOUSE

Date: Friday, July 12, 7-9 p.m. Location: Kay Meek Arts Centre

Arthur Erickson's Dyde House is a new documentary about an early Arthur Erickson house located just outside of Edmonton. Built shortly after the Filberg House, but before Smith Ilor Graham, the Dyde House was one of Erickson's first masonry buildings and his first project outside of BC. It shows an early example of the "flying beams" that characterize his work, and it demonstrates that his awareness of landscape was already in place at this early stage in his career. Just after the Dyde House was completed, the Simon Fraser University commission changed the course of Erickson's career.

Due to the private nature of the clients, this project was not publicized and has not been given the same coverage as his other work. The film tells the story of the house, its architect, and the broader context in which it was built.

Date: Saturday, July 13, 12-6 p.m.

This year, the tour ended with a Modern Tea Party, which took place in the garden at the West Vancouver Art Museum from 4 to 6 p.m. Participants received an "Afternoon Tea Box" catered by The Modern Pantry.

JAZZ CONCERT **SHARON MINEMOTO AND JAMES DANDERFER TRIO**

Date: Sunday, July 14, 1-2:15 p.m.

Location: West Vancouver Memorial Library

This trio explored jazz classics of the '50s and '60s with a few original compositions thrown in.

Pianist Sharon Minemoto is one of Vancouver's most in-demand artists. Her latest album, Dark Night, Bright Stars (Cellar Music), features 12 of her own compositions. Sharon is an active educator, composer, and occasional radio host at CBC.

Composer, clarinetist, and saxophonist James Danderfer has made an impressive mark as a bandleader working with some of North America's finest musicians, including Steve Nelson, Quincy Davis, Don Thompson, and Oliver Gannon. James' melodic approach to the rarely heard bass clarinet is uniquely personal and rooted in the jazz tradition.

Award-winning bassist Paul Rushka has engaged audiences throughout North America, Europe, and Asia with his sonorous tone, assured, confident pulse, and eloquent soloing since 1997.

Congratulations on an incredible home tour this year. Most organized and ambitious tour to date. All of my attendees made it home without any major injuries, so another successful tour!


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


































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
